The Cambridge International Curriculum

At Beaconhouse Sri Inai International, we use the Cambridge International Curriculum for our Primary, Secondary, and IGCSE levels. This curriculum is the Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE). CAIE is the largest provider of international education programs and qualifications for students aged 5 to 17 in the world. Schools in over 160 countries offer CAIE qualifications, and these qualifications are accepted by universities, colleges, and employers globally.

The CAIE program aims to help students become confident, responsible, thoughtful, creative, and involved learners. It provides a step-by-step and challenging education for primary, secondary, and IGCSE students. Teachers can easily adapt the program to create lessons that suit their students' different learning styles.

CAIE also gives teachers support for planning their lessons and how they teach in the classroom. From Early Years, Primary (Year 3) up to Secondary (Year 11), teachers can regularly check how well students are learning and making progress. These checks help teachers see how each student is doing and make sure they get the right support to learn best.

At Beaconhouse, we believe assessment is a vital tool in the educational journey. It helps us understand if our students are reaching their learning goals and making the required progress. Through a variety of assessment methods, we monitor their progress and gather feedback that allows us to better support student progress and ensure they are on the correct pathway. We use student-level data to track our students' attainment and progress continually.



Assessment Approach

Reception

EYFS assessment is continuous and aligned with the Early Learning Goals (ELGs), with progress regularly shared with parents through reports, parent-teacher meetings, and learning journey portfolios.

Years 1–6 Key Stage 1 & Key Stage 2

- >>> Formative Assessment Continuous teacher observations, classroom-based assessments, and regular feedback to support day-to-day learning progress and inform teaching strategies.
- Cambridge Progression Tests (Years 3-6) Internal Cambridge-aligned assessments that track student achievement and ensure appropriate progression in English, English as a Second Language, Mathematics, and Science.
- Cambridge Primary Checkpoint (Optional, Year 6) Learners have the opportunity to take the Cambridge Primary Checkpoint assessments. These assessments provide valuable insights into learners' progress and understanding. Years 7-9 Key Stage 3

Assessment is a continuous process throughout the academic year. At the end of each term there are summative assessments in the majority of subjects as part of the reporting system. This approach facilitates knowledge and skill acquisition and application across all curriculum areas. These assessments are both formative and summative and employ a range of methodologies, including investigative tasks, essay writing, project-based learning, oral presentations and end-of-term subject-based assessments.

>>> Cambridge Secondary Checkpoint (Optional, Year 9) - Learners have the opportunity to take the Cambridge Lower Secondary Checkpoint assessments. These assessments provide valuable insights into learners' progress and understanding. Years 10-11 Key Stage 4

In Key Stage 4, students' performance is evaluated, and International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) grades are awarded with individualised learning targets. Assessments are designed to provide students with continuous feedback regarding their attainment and progress and teach the requirements for IGCSE final examinations and assessments.

- >> In Year 10 Students undertake an internal summative assessment in each subject, which occurs at the end of each term. This forms part of the reporting cycle.
- >> In Year 11 Students undertake a progress assessment at the end of the first term, a mock examination in Term 2 and final examinations in October/November.

CAT4 Assessments

Students from Year 4 to Year 11 take the CAT4 (Cognitive Abilities Test) to provide teachers with valuable individual data that supports effective lesson planning and helps track each student's individual progress over time. All new students on admission sit for a CAT4 assessment. CAT4 assessments are then taken at the following stages: Year 4/5 (Key Stage 2); Year 6/7 (on entry into Key Stage 3); Year 9/10 (on entry into Key Stage 4).

Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs):



Academic Year Structure

The Academic Year is from January to November. This is split into 3 academic terms

Each term typically includes a mid-term break and ends with a holiday before the next term begins. The academic year concludes at the end of November, followed by a longer break in December before the new year starts in January.

Key Features:

Public Holidays & Festive Breaks: The academic calendar aligns with major Malaysian public holidays such as Chinese New Year, Hari Raya Aidilfitri, Deepavali, and National Day, ensuring students and staff can observe and celebrate important cultural and religious events.

Mid-Term and Term Breaks: Each term includes scheduled breaks to provide rest periods, often coinciding with public holidays where possible.

Year-End Break in December: A more extended holiday in December allows families time for travel, festivities, and preparation for the new academic year starting in January.

3 STUDENT ASSESSMENT

Admission is based on the completion of the admission test and the availability and submission of any supporting documentation. From Year 4 students will sit for a CAT4 Assessment, which will provide individual feedback on numeracy and literacy abilities as well as their cognitive abilities. Additional assessments may also be undertaken if this is considered necessary.

The Principal may request to interview both the parents and the child.

The admission test can be taken on Monday to Friday (except public holidays) from 8.00 am to 2.00 pm. Please make an appointment.


